



There are many pathways to certification, and no “wrong door” for professionals to enter through. The Virginia Certification Board (VCB) has developed the following to outline the general requirements for certification, as well as the requirements to obtain other credentials. VCB offers credentials that help a professional progress along a career ladder. While some professionals may choose to stay at a certain level, progression through the ladder comes with the proper experience, education and examination. Professionals may begin wherever their current experience and education level permit. - Certified Peer Recovery Specialist (CPRS)
- Associate Addiction Counselor (AAC)
- Certified Alcohol and Drug Counselor (CADC)
- Certified Community Health Worker (CCHW)
- Certified Clinical Supervisor (CCS)
- Certified Advanced Alcohol and Drug Counselor (CAADC)
